ACT Testing Resources

Wallace State Mobility Program requires a minimum ACT score of 18 (composite or superscore) regardless of date taken.

To obtain ACT test scores, check high school transcript or order the results from ACT. On the ACT website search for: Sending Your Scores, then follow the directions. The test scores will be sent to Wallace State Community College (Center Code 0083).

MOBILITY Applicant must also meet the following admission criteria:

- Unconditional admission to the college – College application must be submitted by the mobility program application deadline.
- Student must be in good standing with the college.
- Receipt of complete nursing application accepted between March 15 and May 15 for fall entry only.
- The online application and instructions are located at www.wallacestate.edu/nursing under the Application Instructions tab.
- A minimum GPA of 2.0 cumulative at current native institution or 2.0 cumulative at institution and a minimum GPA of 2.5 is necessary for nursing required academic courses from which student is transferring is required to be eligible to apply for the mobility nursing program.
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended must be provided to the Admissions Office. The online nursing application requires unofficial transcripts or a degree works report.
- Maintain a grade of “C” or better in ALL general education and nursing courses.
- The following general education requirements must have been successfully completed with a “C” or higher prior to application deadline for application points and if in progress, then must be completed prior to start of program: BIO 201, BIO 202, ENG 101, MTH 100, PSY 210, SPH 106.
- A minimum 18 ACT composite score (National or Residual) is required for admission consideration. Proof of score must be uploaded to the nursing application.
- It is suggested that non-nursing applicants review information on basic nursing care and seek Nursing Assistant (CNA) certification or Nursing Support Technician (NST) certification.
- Students will be ineligible to apply for NUR 209 if they have experienced a withdrawal or non-progression in any previous mobility curriculum including, but not limited to NUR 200, NUR 201 or NUR 209. Students will be eligible to apply to the traditional nursing program. Admission is not guaranteed.
